MINUTES

- Meeting called to order by Kay Dickerson, Chair, there was a quorum. Pledge led by Lenelle Sanchez.
- Council Attendees: Kay Dickerson, Cody Cutler, Lenelle Sanchez, Linda Price, Christy Seiger-Webster, Richard Snow, Jeremy Christensen, and Paulina Flint.
- Council Excused: Darrin Webster
- Council Not Excused: none
- Visitors: none
- Approval of November 6th, 2013 Minutes - motion, seconded, and approved.
- Treasurer's report – Motion to pay any remaining outstanding bills before the end of 2013. Seconded and approved.
- Unified Police Report- Attending: Brooks Green
 - Data provided electronically by Detective Green: Total Calls: 111; Total Cases: 34
- Mayor's Report- Attending: Greg Schulz, Nicole Dunn
 - There will be an increase in trash fees, due to increased landfill tip fees and other cost increases.
 - The municipal budget was fully funded.
 - The county will be starting a newsletter in 2014
 - The ZAP (Zoo, Arts, and Parks) program funds free performance from various programs. For example, the 12/21 matinee performance of Ballet West's Nutcracker. Tickets are available first come, first serve.
 - County is discussing street lighting options. WCTCC should discuss and submit our preferences for locations and physical features (pole type, light type, etc.) *Leave on the agenda.*
 - Mayor McAdams held a breakfast meeting about proposed county government structure change.
 - Voted to ratify the letter sent to the SLCo Mayor's office regarding the proposed county government structure change.
 - Discussion with Nicole Dunn.
- ACCT Report-
 - The current ACCT secretary has resigned and elections for a replacement will be in January.
 - UFA has a new representative, Brian Anderton.
- Southeast Township Days:
 - No items of business.
- Report on UFA and VECC issues
 - Received Sandy City budget details.
 - Sandy City claims to have spent over \$800,000, but the contract is only for \$750,000. No explanation of discrepancy.

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- White City Township is not adequately covered by services. Discuss further next month.
- White City Township has contributed \$346,544 to the UFA budget. Still don't know how it is spent.
- Sandy is considering pulling out of the emergency call center. A letter was sent out to SLCo and Unified Fire to cancel the first responders contract. *Leave on the agenda.*
 - One White City resident experienced significant delays for emergency response due to the two call centers not agreeing. This is an example of the concerns WCTCC has had during this whole discussion. The call centers say they will resolve with additional training. *Leave on the agenda and review in a few months.*
- A meeting was held the last week in August with all stakeholders and county officials. Paulina attended. *Leave on the agenda.*
- Southeast CERT Team
 - New CERT training modules will be out on November 20. They are also online.
 - Council members should think of nominees for the position of emergency volunteer coordinator for our community.
- Other Business:
 - Kay watched a demonstration of concrete lifting to level uneven concrete using concrete slurry. The county started doing some concrete leveling in District 6, using the concrete slurry method.
 - Several of the White City monuments have been vandalized or damaged. No further repairs have been completed. The cement repairs and damaged bricks will be coordinated with the water company, which has lifting equipment. *Leave on the agenda.*
 - Westbound 10600 South at 1300 East has had an island installed which is causing a traffic hazard from people trying to get into or out of the McDonald's and Chevron on the Northwest corner of the intersection. Sandy City is responsible for this intersection and road area. Letter of concern should be sent to Patrick at SLCo to discuss with Sandy City. Discussion tabled until next meeting. *Leave on the agenda.*
 - White City Water has been notified about an increase in fees from the State water board. Council motion: "The State agency should go through appropriations of the state instead of fees to local agencies." Seconded and approved. *Leave on the agenda.*
 - Elections for board positions were held and all current board members were re-elected.
- Council Elections: The council voted to keep the officers as currently constituted.
- January's meeting moved to January 8, 2014, due to the first Wednesday being a holiday.
- Meeting was adjourned at 8:16 pm.
