MINUTES

- Meeting called to order by Kay Dickerson, Chair, there was a quorum. Pledge of Allegiance by Darrin Webster.
- Council Attendees: Kay Dickerson, Christy Seiger-Webster, Jeremy Christensen, Richard Snow, Darrin Webster, Cody Cutler, Paulina Flint and Linda Price.
- Council Excused: Lenelle Sanchez,
- Council Not Excused: none
- Visitors: Janice and Don Dumas, Bob Parker and Scout Troop 757, Janice Kirby, Kelly Collinson
- Approval of January 7, 2015 Minutes – Motion, seconded, and approved.
- Treasurer’s report – Motion, seconded, and approved.
 - Website fee of \$300 was paid.
 - The bank has sent notice that it will begin charging for paper statements. Motion to authorize changing to digital statements. Seconded and approved.
- Unified Police Report – Attending: Detective Brooks Green
 - Data provided electronically by Detective Green: Total Calls: 102; Total Cases: 32
- Mayor’s Report - Attending: none.
 - The West Side Councils met to prioritize Greg Schultz’s work, since they hired him. SLCo Mayor’s Office says Greg is their employee and they control his work priorities. *Leave on the agenda.*
- ACCT Report -
 - Paulina has resigned from ACCT. Cody is replacing her on ACCT. Linda and Jeremy are alternates.
 - The Community Preservation bill is very different from the proposed bill. ACCT met with Senator Maynes on February 3, 2015 to tell her the Preservation Committee has not approved of the bill. The bill is currently protected. Paulina will keep us updated.
- Report on UFA and VECC issues (no changes reported at this meeting)
 - Received Sandy City budget details.
 - Sandy City claims to have spent over \$800,000, but the contract is only for \$750,000. No explanation of discrepancy.
 - White City Township is not adequately covered by services. Discuss further next month.
 - White City Township has contributed \$346,544 to the UFA budget. Still don’t know how it is spent.
 - Sandy is considering pulling out of the emergency call center. A letter was sent out to SLCo and Unified Fire to cancel the first responders contract. *Leave on the agenda.*
 - One White City resident experienced significant delays for emergency response due to the two call centers not agreeing. This is an example of the concerns WCTCC has had during this whole discussion. The call centers say they will resolve with additional training. A Draper City man died waiting for response

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following 911 delay. Mayor McAdams working with Brad Dee to sponsor a bill to require a consolidated 911 system. *Leave on the agenda and review in a few months.*

- A meeting was held the last week in August with all stakeholders and county officials. Paulina attended.
- A meeting was held with UFA Chief Jensen, UFA ACCT liaison Anderton, and others regarding the first response contract with Sandy City. Chief Jensen to investigate why payments in excess of the contract value were made and re-assess the contract. Follow up in March.
- Told Nicole Dunn and UFA that delays and any withdrawal from VECC and WCTCC would withdraw from UFA. White City continues to have issues with this situation. *Leave on the agenda.*
- Southeast Township Days
 - Motion to proceed revise the date of Southeast Township Days 2015 to be held on August 22, 2015. Motion seconded and approved.
- Other Business:
 - White City Water has been notified about an increase in fees from the State water board. Council motion: “The State agency should go through appropriations of the state instead of fees to local agencies.” Seconded and approved. *Leave on the agenda.*
 - Willow Creek Annex – Sandy City successfully completed their annexation in Willow Creek.
 - Sandy Hills recently performed a community survey in conjunction with Utah State University. The purpose of the survey was to establish the community member’s beliefs regarding services (e.g. Unified Fire, SLCo municipal services, etc.) and government structure (e.g. SLCo unincorporated area versus joining a city, etc.).
 - These surveys cost \$2 per survey. USU will determine the coverage necessary, typically 40% of the residents must be surveyed. Motion to perform a survey with USU on the resident’s beliefs/opinions on community services and government structure. Motion seconded and approved.
 - Don Dumas raised a concern about Sandy City plans for a waste incinerator to be built at the Sandy Public Works yard at 8800 S and 700 W, as reported in the Salt Lake Tribune on January 22, 2015. He feels that White City Township would be negatively impacted by this facility due to reduced air quality. Following discussion, a motion was made for the WCTCC to file a concern with Utah Department of Environmental Quality. Motion was seconded and approved. Paulina to draft. Christy to obtain an email address for submission.
 - Community sidewalks were discussed. There is still confusion regarding where the proposed sidewalk on Garnet Drive will actually be installed (East versus West side). Additionally, SLCo recently asked about Poppy Lane. Jena Carver from SLCo will attend the meeting next month to discuss.
 - With increased bussing at Alta View Elementary there have been additional traffic and pedestrian safety issues near the school.
- Council Matters: Secretary needs to go with the Treasurer to the Bank and get added to the accounts.
- Meeting was adjourned at 8:29 pm.
