### MINUTES

- Meeting called to order by Kay Dickerson, Chair, there was a quorum. Allan Perry led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- Council Attendees: Kay Dickerson, Christy Seiger-Webster, Cody Cutler, Richard Snow, Darrin Webster, Paulina Flint and Linda Price.
- Council Excused: Lenelle Sanchez
- Council Not Excused: none
- Visitors: Allan Perry, Jeff Haney, Steve Wrigley
- Approval of August 2, 2017 Minutes – Motion, seconded and approved.
- Treasurer’s report – Motion, seconded and approved.
  - Linda will send out the proposed WCTCC 2018 budget numbers.
  - Motion to ask SLCo for the entire Southeast Township Days event budget, rather than working through all the different community councils. *Leave on agenda.*
- Unified Police Report – Attending: Detective Paula Stinson
  - Total Calls: 153; Total Cases: 51.
  - Ongoing issues:
    - Parking on streets around Bear Park. Has impacted emergency vehicle access to residents. Detective Stinson will continue to follow up and will get back to us.
    - Council asked about traffic on Sego Lily at the school cross-walks. Detective Stinson has contacted Sandy City and the school. She will continue to follow up and will get back to us.
- White City Township Metro Council (WCTMC) Report –
  - WCTMC has to submit budget requests by Friday, July 8, 2017.
- White City Township Community Council (WCTCC) –
  - Need a new representative from District #5 (replace Jeremy Christensen). Need to look into advertising/getting the word out. Included in the newsletter.
  - Need a committee for assisting with developing a General Plan for WCT. Planning and Zoning is currently operating without a guiding document.
  - Need a committee for coordinating utility and other public works issues within WCT. Recommended issues need documentation.
  - Revisit additional street lights for capital improvement list.
- Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District (GSLMSD) and other services –
  - The sidewalk addition along 9400 South at ski connect is included in the 2017 budget and is in the planning phase.
  - SLCo Engineering current and upcoming projects (*Leave on the agenda*):
    - Sego Lily Drive traffic study – to account for the change in traffic pattern resultant from Sandy City removing the traffic light near the Sandy Library and the new pedestrian bridge. Short term they are adding more crossing guards at the cross-walks across Sego Lily Drive. Public meeting result is resident’s consensus is they don’t want the road restriped. They are concerned about the existing traffic issues and the bike path will make things worse. Suggest adding sidewalks along Sego Lily.

- SLCo moving forward on building a trail along the old canal. They are looking at adding speed bumps on Galena Drive where the trail will cross over to Edgemont Elementary. Leave on the agenda.
- The annual waste disposal tip waiver vouchers are available. Each council member will be given some to distribute. See Kay. HB 115 is proposing to double the tip fees at Solid Waste Disposal facilities and SLCo opposes this bill.
- Waste and recycle are beginning a new reusable bag campaign “BYOB”. The plastic bags are really messing up the recycle machines. Recycle them through the grocery stores.
- ACCT Report –
  - The annual meeting with the Salt Lake County Council is on September 12, 2017.
  - The Mountain Accord is being disbanded and replaced with an interlocal agreement called the Central Wasatch Commission. The stated goals are protecting the water shed, transportation improvements, and funding sources. *Leave on the agenda.*
    - Motion: WCTCC go on record as opposing the Central Wasatch Commission. Seconded and approved.
    - Central Wasatch Commission is currently with a state legislative committee which is reviewing it and wants to know why the state was initially bypassed. ACCT will continue to monitor.
- Emergency Preparedness –
  - Add an emergency information tab to the website. *Leave on the agenda.*
- Other Business:
  - Historical Preservation Committee/White Tower Swimming Pool has been disbanded. We received a letter from them that they are now for profit.
  - Canyons School District, Steve Wrigley and Jeff Haney, discussed the upcoming bond vote and the Canyons plans for the WCT schools. They plan to rebuild either Edgemont or Bell View elementary schools. They will be seeking community input on which one the community wants rebuilt, assuming the bond passes.
  - Discussion of meeting schedule for the rest of the calendar year. Due to the number of council members who will be absent in November, Motion to cancel the meeting on November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017. Seconded and approved.
